Scammers might use letters, telephone calls, the internet and text messages to contact you.

If you think you might have been the victim of a scam, visit the [Citizens Advice Website](#) for further help.

The following services are available to help reduce nuisance telephone calls and scam mail;

The Mail Preference Service (MPS). Registering with MPS is free

The Telephone Preference Service (TPS). The TPS is the UK's only official 'Do Not Call' register for landlines and Mobile Numbers. It allows people and businesses to opt out of unsolicited live sales and marketing calls.

This service is free and quick to register a telephone number. Online form-Telephone Preference Service(tpsonline.org.uk). click to REGISTER, which takes you to a very easy and straightforward form.

Remember-if an offer sounds too good to be true-it probably is!

4.Financial Statement

Current account balance as at 7th February = £1,766.00m This balance has been boosted by Flutter payments up to the end of January

Savings account balance=£1,420.23. This includes £600.00 held for future events, £800.00 transferred from the current account to be used for the benefit of the whole community, £20.23 as end of year interest.

TOTAL HELD IN BOTH ACCOUNTS=£3,186.23

Payments in since last meeting - £60.00 Flutter payments

TOTAL PAYMENTS IN=£60.00

Payments out since last meeting- £150.00 (2 Flutter winners for December 2023 and 1 flutter winner for January 2024). £5.00- HSBC Monthly bank charges. £176.38 Recreation Ground plants and materials as agreed in July 2023.

TOTAL PAYMENTS OUT=£322.38

This still leaves approx. £820.00 held that could use towards a good cause and benefit for the whole community.

The Annual General Grant Application 2024 to Kirkburton Parish Council for £300.00 has been applied for with a decision later and, if successful, payment in April/May 2024.

Cllr Armer sent his apologies along with the response to a query about KC lighting the Beacon on Castle Hill on June 6th at 9.15pm for the D-DAY 80 celebrations planned around the country.

KC response as follows

“The fire beacon did not get repaired after it was blown down in the high winds in February 2023 and with all the best efforts to get it repaired including the possibility of a donation from a local resident for those repairs it didn’t materialise, and the repairs were not thought to be a Council priority in the present climate”
